RISKY BEHAVIOURS IN ADOLESCENCE

What are risky behaviours?

Drinking

Smoking

Vaping

Drug use

Relevance of early adolescence

- New social/peer networks, new experiences/experimentation, self-discovery
- Less parental monitoring
- First engagement in risky behaviour

Associated dangers

- Physical and mental health risks
- Engagement in anti-social and criminal activities
- Early risky behaviour often predicts subsequent behaviour

RECENT LEGISLATIVE CHANGES

SMOKING:

Tobacco Free Ireland Programme (2016):

- Prioritise the protection of children
- Target 'disadvantaged' communities
- Packaging / price
- Ban on smoking in a car with a child

VAPING:

Popularity exploded amongst young people recently:

- Ban on sale to U-18s (2023)
- Ban on single-use vapes (2024)
- Ban on certain flavours (2024)

DRINKING:

Public Health (Alcohol) Act, 2018

- "delay initiation of alcohol consumption by young people"
- Limits on advertising near schools, playgrounds, cinemas

RESEARCH QUESTIONS

1. What impact (if any) have recent legislative changes had on risky behaviours among 13-year-olds in Ireland?

2. To what extent have socially-driven disparities been impacted?

3. What other factors are driving risky behaviour?

METHODS

GROWING UP IN IRELAND

- National longitudinal study of children and young people
- Est. 2007 "to provide evidence to inform policy and services for young people"
- Wide range of development outcomes:
 - Physical health

- Socio-emotional well-being
- Education / civic engagement
- Family / socio-demographic characteristics

- Dual cohort design
 - Cohort '98 (n ≈ 8,500) recruited at 9yrs / Cohort '08 (n ≈ 11,000) recruited at 9mths
- Both cohorts interviewed at age 13:
 - Cohort '98 in 2011 (pre-legislation)
 - Cohort '08 in 2021 (post-legislation)

METHODS

13-YEAR-OLD:

Smoking

Ever smoked? / Currently smoke?

Vaping

– Ever vaped?

Drinking

- Ever had an alcoholic drink? How often?

Drugs

- Tried cannabis, or other drugs?

PARENTS:

Smoking

- Do you currently smoke?
- If so, how much?

Drinking

- AUDIT screening tool
- Binge drinking (monthly)

SOCIAL CLASS:


Family type

Parental education

Family income

FINDINGS...

Fig: Risky Behaviours, Overall Prevalence



Any Risky Behaviour?


If 13YO answered yes to at least one of....

- + Ever taken drugs?


Fig: Any Risky Behaviour, overall





















REGRESSION MODELLING: Odds Ratios: Engagement in Risky Behaviour at Age 13

Low income family	1.52**	1.24
Low parental education	1.63**	1.25
Parent smokes	1.53**	1.39**
Parent binges	1.32**	1.22*

Parent binges	1.32**	1.22*	1.43*	1.46*

FINDINGS: SMOKING

Cohort '98:

- Child twice as likely to smoke if...
 - ...in one-parent family
 - ...parent smokes

DRINKING

Cohort '98:

- Parental drinking patterns comparable across cohorts
- Similar child risk (OR=1.4-15) for...
 - One-parent status, parental education and parental binge drinking

Cohort '08:

- Child smoking rates much lower but...
 - ...one-parent status risk as before
 - ...almost 4-fold increased risk if parent smoked

Cohort '08:

- 13-year-old at increased risk if....
 - ...they lived in a one-parent home (OR=2.9)
 - ...parent binge drank regularly (OR=1.6)

SUMMARY

- Rates of risky behaviour broadly improving
 - Due to legislation?
- Social gradient tempered somewhat, one-parent status still predictive
 - Consider effect of the COVID pandemic?
- Interventions should target parents' risky behaviour
 - Strongly linked with child risk, smoking more impactful

Future Research:

- Consider other predictors
 - Parenting
 - Parental stress
- Explore risky behaviours independently
 - Related but distinct: single parents more likely to smoke, less likely to binge drink
- Vaping
- Trends at 17yrs, 20yrs...












FINDINGS: VAPING

Fig: Prevalence overall, Cohort '08



- Vaping three times as prevalent as smoking
- No comparable data for C'98 given newness of this phenomenon
- Social gradient present
- Parental behaviour also important
